

GRANT COUNTY PUD COMMISSIONERS FACT SHEET

Information from Washington's Title 54 RCW: Public Utility Districts:

- Only a registered voter who resides in a commissioner district may be a candidate for office.
- Only voters of a commissioner district may vote at a primary to nominate candidates for commissioner of that district.
- Voters of the entire public utility district may vote at a general election to elect a person as commissioner of any of the districts.
- The terms of office of each PUD commissioner district shall be six years; commissioners at large shall serve four-year terms.

- Compensation:
 - Pay of \$1,800 per month (\$21,600 per year)
 - Per diem of \$104 per day on PUD business (not to exceed \$14,560 per year)
 - Annual maximum of \$31,160
 - Reimbursed reasonable expenses for PUD business and meetings including subsistence, lodging and travel
- Benefits include:
 - Medical, dental and life insurance
 - State retirement 401A, 457, Health Reimbursement Account (HRA)

 - Six-year term
 - B-At-Large
 - Four-year term
- Other Positions
 - District #1
 - Six-year term
 - District #3
 - Six-year term
 - A-At-Large
 - Four-year term
